



## CREATION WOOD INSTALLATION

### **Code of Practice**

The installation of this product is covered by BS8203 Code of Practice for the Installation of Resilient Floorcoverings.

The ambient temperature of the areas to be covered should be at least 18°C 24 hours prior to, during, and after installation.

Material must be allowed to acclimatise unpacked in the area in which it is to be installed for a period of at least 24 hours.

**Boxes are clearly marked with a batch number and the product should be checked for match before laying.**

**Note: Gerflor Creation Wood has a non-directional pattern and can be reserved laid if required.**

### **Subfloors**

Must be dry, smooth and flat. Please refer to separate SITES & SUBFLOORS data sheet.

### **Adhesives**

Suitable adhesives include:

Tremco	Treadfast 105 & 108
Henkel	Thomsit K188E & K188S

**Note: In conservatory areas a recommended epoxy adhesive must be used.**

### **Laying Creation Wood Planks**

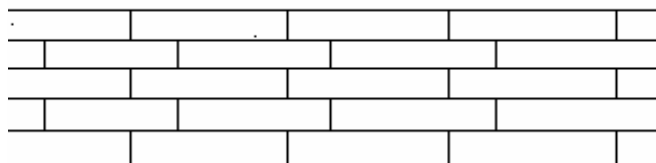
Careful planning and consideration is necessary if the desired overall effect is to be achieved.

It is customary to start laying tiles from a central position. A chalk line should be struck halfway across the width and length of the area to be covered to determine the centre point.

Once these two guide lines are struck it is recommended that a single row of tiles be laid without adhesive, widthwise and lengthwise to check both positioning and patterning.

Apply adhesive according to the manufacturers instructions.

Start laying tiles from the central axis, place tiles into the adhesive ensuring joints are tightly butted, pressing firmly and evenly making sure not to trap air bubbles. The remaining tiles are then laid with staggered



Border tiles are now cut to size by placing them on the last full tile stuck and scribing them using a spare full tile placed against the wall as a template.
